Dr. LAM Ling, Lorinda

Dr. Lam is a registered clinical psychologist working in the Child Assessment Service, Department of Health, in Hong Kong, SAR. She holds a Doctoral Degree in Clinical Psychology, graduated from the University of Hong Kong. She has been working with children with wide range of neurodevelopmental disorders which resulted in various learning, behavioural and emotional challenges with more than 25 years of clinical experience. Over the past years of both her clinical and research work, she has cultivated her devoted interest in working for the children with special needs, especially for children with Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD) and physical impairment and complex communication needs. Her dissertations were on parental attitudes in raising children with autism spectrum disorder, emotional processing and theory-of-mind abilities of children with autism. She participated in the development of Hong Kong Scales for Assessment of Theory of Mind (HKAToM).

Ms. Yip is the Senior Physiotherapist of Heep Hong Society. Currently, she holds a casual academic role at The University of Queensland, where she shares her expertise and knowledge in child development and paediatric physiotherapy.

Over 35 years of clinical experience treating babies and children with developmental, musculoskeletal, and neurological conditions in Australia and Hong Kong, Dr. Leung's career includes roles in non-government organizations, hospitals, and community health clinics. She collaborates closely with various healthcare professionals, including pediatricians, occupational therapists, speech pathologists, psychologists, social workers, podiatrists, and orthotists.
